I. The Implicit ACCUSATION (2:17)

If being justified by faith alone in Jesus Christ alone really means abandoning the Law, then you're sinning, and, more than that, Christ is leading you to sin!

II. The Impassioned REFUTATION (2:18-19, 21)

1. The Law was never meant to be a means of justification. Rather, the purpose of the Law was: a.) to expose our sin and b.) to drive us to faith in Christ.
2. Abandoning the Law is not a sin because the old categories of sin are redefined with the coming of Christ. For the Christian, the Law has served its purpose and has been fulfilled by Christ.
3. To "rebuild" the Law as a means of justification, is now the ultimate sin, because doing so nullifies the grace of God and the death of Christ.
4. The Law cannot save us, it can only slay us and we must be slain to really find life in God through the cross of Christ.

III. The Incredible DECLARATION (2:20)

1. *I have been crucified with Christ . . .*
The sinning and self-justifying "I", has been crucified with Christ.
2. *it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; . . .*
The Resurrected Jesus now lives in me . . .
3. *the life which I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself up for me.*
I live every part of my daily life by faith in Jesus, joyfully and gratefully grounded in and motivated by His love and sacrifice.

5. Explain why Paul's incredible DECLARATION in 2:20 is both mysterious and practical? How is it practical to your daily life?
